
Every Friday there is a 'values' assembly and a pupil from each class is chosen by their class teacher to receive a values certificate.

- No home learning needs to be handed in, but we expect it to be completed before Monday





## Reading


- Blue reading journal

- Choose a book which will challenge and expand vocabulary.


### Accelerated reader


- Teachers will be monitoring children's quizzing and checking that they are reading books appropriate to their ZPD level.
- Regular reading conversations with class teacher and TA.




















### Assessment



Children are assessed through work in lessons and low-stakes quizzes.

In the spring and summer term, more formal tests are undertaken in reading, spelling, arithmetic and maths reasoning.

The children get used to working under timed conditions and increase familiarity with the layout of tests.


For those that need extra support, tests may be split into small chunks for independent work, or children may be coached alongside a TA.

### Rewards

Children can earn reward time during the week – & this may be referred to as 'golden time'.





## EE tells parents: don't give under-11s smartphones

One of the UK's largest mobile network providers is advising parents not to give primary schoolaged children their own smartphone.

It said that under-11s should be given "non-smart" devices that have similar capabilities as old brick phones.



- All social media apps, including Instagram and Tiktok are aged rated 13+. WhatsApp is 16+.
- Children should not be using these without parental consent or careful monitoring.
- On the <u>Google Play</u> store, most social media apps are rated 'Parental Guidance Recommended' by PEGI. This symbol comes up as an exclamation mark. This rating recommends that parents carefully consider whether these apps are suitable for children under 18.



### How can you help?

- Times tables practise recalling the 2, 5 and 10 tables
   (from Year 2) and learning connections between 2x 4x
   and 8x (the children know this from Year 3)
- Reading with your child regularly and recording in RR
- Fostering independence & organisation
- Inform your child's teacher about any concerns
- Chicken helpers!
- Parent / carer helpers to listen to children read during school time
