A CONVERSATION WITH YOUR CHILD ...

We are reaching out to ask for your support in addressing a growing concern within our school: the condition in which the children's toilets are being left. Recently, we have encountered a series of issues that have created both a maintenance burden and an unpleasant environment for the students.

Current issues that we are experiencing are as follows:

- Excessive use of toilet roll which contributes to the blocking of toilets.
- \cdot Whole toilet rolls being put down the toilet.
- Putting objects down the toilets/in urinals with the intention of blocking them.
- \cdot Not flushing the toilet.
- · Emptying the soap dispensers.
- · Food being put down the toilet.
- \cdot Standing on the toilet seats.
- \cdot Toilet roll strewn across the floor.

Staff members have already spoken to pupils on multiple occasions about these issues, emphasising the importance of respecting our shared spaces and the impact of their actions on their peers and school staff who clean these spaces. Despite these conversations, the concerns persist, which is why we are now reaching out for your support at home as well.

We kindly ask that you speak with your child about the importance of respecting shared spaces, including our school facilities. By encouraging responsible and considerate behaviour, we can work together to create a clean and functional environment. Thank you for your partnership and support in helping us maintain a safe, respectful, and hygienic school setting for all students.

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
